





#### David's House of Refuge Kinshasa, D.R. Congo

Before January, the 25 boys in David's House of Refuge lived much of their lives on the streets with little food, no bed, and no one to love them--all of which they have now found in the loving care of their new mom, Theresa Cox, a missionary from the United States.

home. The older ones attend a


government-run school.

Bethany Christian Center has a group of six homes that care for a total of 59 children. Each home is like its own family.

The daily life of each family goes something like this:

6:30 am Wake up and get ready for the day. 7:00 am Family prayer time and then off to school.

8:00 am to 4:00 pm School starts every morning with chapel, and the kids

stay there all day.

Kids arrive home from school and have an hour of free time 5:00 pm

before dinner.

Bed time!!

6:00 pm The family spends time together during the evening meal.

7:00 pm to 9:00 pm Homework and/or play time. 9:00 pm Family devotions.

## **ABANSA Homes**

Children of Promise provides sponsorship for eleven homes in Venezuela. Each home cares for 10-20 children.

Arise and get ready for the day. 6:30 and

7:00 am Breakfast for those who go to school in the morning and off to school. (Half of the children attend school in the morning and the other half go in the afternoon.)

8:00 am Those who have afternoon classes eat breakfast and begin their chores around the house.

10:00 am to 12:00 pm Everyone does their laundry by hand. When all of the laundry is done, the kids have free time to do homework, play games, and go for walks.

12:00 pm Everyone eats lunch in shifts. Those who have afternoon school leave. The younger children who are home have a "siesta" (nap) after lunch for about two hours.

3:00 to 5:00 pm Free time to play or do homework.

The "family" comes together for dinner and family devotions. 7:30 pm

8:00 pm Bed time!



## Children of Promise

In India each of our homes care for anywhere from 30-100 children. Imagine having 50 brothers and sisters! A typical day goes something like this:

6:00 am Get up for family prayer and

devotions.

6:30 am Morning chores and preparing

for the day.

7:30 am Eat breakfast and get ready

for school.

12:00 pm Arrive home from school

(school is only 1/2 days there). Afternoon chores, homework,

and free time to play.

7:00 pm Eat dinner and have family

devotions.
